Frank is a British screenwriter, novelist and occasional actor. He was born in Liverpool and studied English at Keble College, Oxford. He still lives in Liverpool with his wife and seven children.

In 2004 he won the Carnegie Medal for his immensely popular children's book, *Millions*, based on his own screenplay for the film of the same name. His more recent novel, *Framed*, was shortlisted for the Whitbread Book of the Year and for the Carnegie Medal. His third novel, *Cosmic*, was published in 2008, and was shortlisted for the Guardian Children's Fiction Prize and the Roald Dahl Funny Prize.

His latest play, *Proper Clever*, has recently been staged at the Liverpool Playhouse.

Our students may be surprised to know that he has also been a regular screenwriter for Coronation Street and Brookside as well as its spin off *Damon and Debbie*. His other screenwriting credits include *Welcome to Sarajevo*, *24 Hour Party People* and the recent BBC2 film, *God on Trial*.

It has been an honour to have him with us this evening at St. John Plessington Catholic College and we thank him for taking the time, in his hectic schedule, to celebrate with us the hard work and success of our students.
