"Accepting one another"

Luke 19:1-10

Jesus was going through the city of Jericho. A man was there named Zacchaeus, who was a very important tax collector, and he was wealthy. He wanted to see who Jesus was, but he was not able because he was too short to see above the crowd. He ran ahead to a place where Jesus would come, and he climbed a sycamore tree so he could see him. When Jesus came to that place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down! I must stay at your house today."

Zacchaeus came down quickly and welcomed him gladly. All the people saw this and began to complain, "Jesus is staying with a sinner!"

But Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "I will give half of my possessions to the poor. And if I have cheated anyone, I will pay back four times more."

Jesus said to him, "Salvation has come to this house today, because this man also belongs to the family of Abraham. The Son of Man came to find lost people and save them."

Each one of us needs to be loved and accepted by others. A person who isolates themselves from others is a desperately sad figure. In our Gospel story Zacchaeus is alone up his tree and hated by everyone for being a Tax collector. But Jesus notices him. Jesus changes his plans. He didn't intend to stay in Jericho. But something happened that made him change his mind. That something was "Compassion, Mercy and Love".

Zacchaeus had climbed the tree because he was curious to see Jesus. But then Jesus stopped under the tree and told Zacchaeus that he wanted to stay at his house that night. The crowds must have been really shocked at the words of Jesus. The crowds must have been as equally shocked by Zacchaeus's reaction, climbing down the tree he told Jesus that he would give half his possessions to the poor and payback four times over the taxes he had wrongly collected from the people. Jesus cared about him. Zacchaeus would not let the moment pass.
