## SIXTH FORM NEWS



This week, the Sixth Form Council met with the Catering Manager to discuss the food available for Sixth Formers throughout the day. Previous to this, a questionnaire had been sent out to all Sixth Form students to find out their views on the range and quality of products, the times the food was available, and the prices. Also, many students had made constructive suggestions for improvement, e.g. a wider range of hot dishes and full breakfasts for a set price.

The implications of the introduction of healthy eating options were discussed and students were asked to give their views on a number of new products to be introduced. These included low fat hot chocolate and chocolate muffins, smoothies, yoghurt desserts and cous-cous salad. All received a positive response and will be going onto the menu. Other initiatives to be introduced are a range of hot dishes to be available, students will be able to pre-order food and set prices for meal deals.

A further discussion then took place about the food available at break and lunch time for the rest of the College. Further meetings will take place with the Lower College Council to discuss this further and sample other options.
