Landmine Action Week

This week is landmine action week, an internationally observed week, with the intention of drawing attention to the dangers of landmines. They are laid in times of war, but are not collected back when a ceasefire is announced, meaning that they remain a threat in times of peace. They are the residue of war. A soldier with a gun can choose to shoot at another person - soldier or civilian - or not. A landmine is indiscriminate and will explode under the foot of any person, maiming or killing its victim. We cannot solve the problem of landmines in places that have been torn by war, but we can pray for those who suffer from the devastation they cause and try, in our own way, to create a sense of peace in our own lives and in the lives of those with whom we live and work.

Holy God,

I pray for people who are victims of the devastating effects of landmines. I pray that they will know your love and that they will be given suitable support in recovering from their injuries or learning to live with a disability. I ask that those who are fighting in wars at the present time will act responsibly, fighting so that there will be peace, not further destruction. Amen
