The Science Department have continued the theme of space camp by taking the 'Rocket Road show' to St Joseph's and Our Lady's and St Edward's. Mr Moore, with the help of Mr Nibbs and 6th Formers, Joe Furey, Gemma Wise, Damien Passman and Mathew Sayce went on a mission to teach the teams to launch a rocket high into the sky. Armed with recycled water bottles, citric acid and bicarbonate of soda, the staff and students demonstrated the principles of flight and then let the Y5 teams loose.

A team from St Joseph's managed to send their rocket approximately 15 metres into

the air. They completed the task by learning about combustion when Mr Moore set off a Hydrogen Rocket. This task is designed as a Transition activity, giving Pupils a head start for Key Stage 3, when they will be learning about Forces in Year 7.

YR 10 GCSE GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK


