

He came to Nazareth where he had been reared. As he always did on the Sabbath, he went to the meeting place. When he stood up to read, he was handed the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll, he found the place where it was

God's Spirit is on me;

he's chosen me to preach the Message of good news to the poor, sent me to announce pardon to prisoners and recovery of sight to the

to set the burdened and battered free, to announce, "This is God's vear to act!"

He rolled up the scroll, handed it back to the assistant, and sat down. Every eye in the place was on him, intent. Then he started, "You've just heard Scripture make history. It came true just now in this place.

All who were there, watching and listening, were surprised at how well he spoke. But they also said, "Isn't this Joseph's son, the one we've known since he was a youngster?"

He answered, "I suppose you're going to quote the proverb, 'Doctor, go heal yourself. Do here in your hometown what we heard you did in Capernaum.' Well, let me tell you something: No prophet is ever welcomed in his hometown. Isn't it a fact that there were many widows in Israel at the time of Elijah during that three and a half years of drought when famine devastated the land, but the only widow to whom Elijah was sent was in Sarepta in Sidon? And there were many lepers in Israel at the time of the prophet Elisha but the only one cleansed was Naaman

That set everyone in the meeting place seething with anger. They threw

him out, banishing him from the village, then took him to a mountain cliff at the edge of the village to throw him to his doom, but he gave them the slip and was on his way.

The Greeks and the Romans had loads of gods, for every possible job; but they were unreal and of no help to ordinary people. Our God on the other hand, felt so strongly about knowing and understanding our life, that he became human, just like us. Jesus experienced all the daily ups and downs of life, the happiness and the pain. We could have no better friend who knows, understands and can help.

Each one of us is called into a friendship with Jesus, and we are also called to follow his example in the way in which we live our lives.

And just like Jesus that may make us unpopular with the people who know. After all the crowds in our gospel, even tried to throw Jesus down the mountain cliff, because he challenged the people of his time. Do we challenge people to become followers of Jesus today?

This prayer is based on the writing of Saint Teresa of Avila. She showed how we are called to be witnesses and followers of Christ today.

> Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which is to shine out Christ's compassion in the world. Yours are the feet through which he is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which he is to bless all people now. Amen
