
Any old fabric you have around the house that you could donate to the textiles department. People have been very generous in the past but our stocks are running low.

Theme of the week—Sorry is the Hardest word

"Sorry is the hardest word"

One of the most difficult words to say is "sorry", often because we don't really want to face up to the truth about ourselves. How often do people say, "It's not my fault" (when obviously it is). One of the signs that we are growing up and maturing is accepting responsibility for our actions, admitting that we make mistakes and that we do wrong. Before we can genuinely say "sorry" and mean it, we must repent (ask for forgiveness). We must truly feel sorry.

Now there were some present at that time who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their sacrifices. Jesus answered, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish. Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish." Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree,

planted in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it, but did not find any. So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?'

"Sir", the man replied, "leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it. If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not, then cut it down.' " Luke 13:1-9
