# SJP Young Designers In Clean Sweep at Competition



On Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March the school minibus plus 16 SJP students set off to Neston High School to take part in the Rotary Club Schools Technology Competition.

The four teams of four did not know what to expect but had to take with them a set of basic hand tools and equipment. After arrival each team was shown to their allotted table and had their first glance at the task in hand. We entered one team into the basic level (Year 9), one into the intermediate level (Year 10) and two teams into the advanced level (Year 12).

All teams carried out the same basic task but the higher the level the tighter the assessment criteria. Each team was given the same basic kit of materials and had to build a device to advertise a charity of their choice. There had to be a flashing light on the top of the device and a promotional logo for the charity clearly displayed. Finally the light had to flash as many times as possible for the basic group and for the advanced it also had to flash once every second.

At judging time the Rotarians took into account the portfolio and also the teamwork during the day as well as the number and accuracy of the flashes. The results were very close but SJP were victorious in each of the three levels.





# **Try Again**



The idea of stoning a woman to death because she had been unfaithful to her husband (this week's reading) seems very barbaric to us (thankfully Jesus saved her) but it shows that the people who lived in Jesus' time had clear and firm standards and values, something that some people

don't seem to have today. Jesus told the woman, "Go and don't sin anymore." She was given the chance to make a fresh start. This is the message of Lent: if we are really sorry God will forgive us and we can start afresh and try again.

But Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around him, and he sat down to teach them. The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery in the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" They were

using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him.

But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "If any one of you is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground.

At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."
