This weekend Sam successfully Newton Northwest Swimming competed in the Regional Club Championships Manchester Aquatics Centre. Sam took part in the 100m breaststroke race where he cruised through the heats and earned his place in the final. In the heats Sam achieved a time of 1 minute 16 seconds and during the final he swam a personal best of 1 minute 15 seconds so clinching the Silver Medal. Sam has been swimming for seven years and competes with Wirral Metro. This coming weekend he will be involved in the Championships to retain his Gold Medal in the 200m breaststroke which he won last vear. Sam's future ambition is to reach the nationals and move towards a successful career in swimming.



Pupils from Year 10 enjoyed a unique experience on Tuesday 8th June, when they became Archaeologists for the day!

In the first session a series of archaeological 'tasters' showed pupils exactly what happens on an archaeological excavation. Pupils laid their own trench and recorded it using archaeological techniques. They then 'excavated' their own finds in the lab, washed them and re-assembled them, just like archaeologists!

These ongoing sessions are being held on Tuesday evenings 3:30 – 4:40. They are being run in partnership with World Museum Liverpool, who are kindly donating genuine finds and activities for pupils to handle. Weekly Theme— Compassion

Not long after that, Jesus went to Nain village. His disciples were with him, along with quite a large crowd. As they approached the village gate, they met a funeral procession—a woman's only son was being carried out for burial. And the mother was a widow. When Jesus saw her, his heart broke. He said to her. "don't cry." Then he went over and touched the coffin. The pallbearers stopped. He said, "young man, I tell you: Get up." The dead son sat up and began talking. Jesus presented him to his mother.

They all realised they were in a place of holy mystery, that God was at work among them. They were quietly worshipful—and then noisily grateful, calling out among themselves, "God is back, looking to the needs of his people!" The news of Jesus spread all through the country.

Luke 7: 11-17

We so often hear sad stories about people who are very sick, or people who have been affected by natural disasters, or people who

have been forced to leave their own countries because of fear and violence, and our natural reaction is to want to help them.

The word compassion comes from two Latin words, "cum passio", which means "suffering with." When, like Jesus, in this week's gospel story, we feel for someone, we suffer with them, we show compassion. Sometimes we can do things to help, but many times we are unable to help them directly, and we feel frustrated. It is then that we can do one very important thing: we can pray for them.

God of wisdom and love, from you all goodness comes.

Help us to show your love and goodness to those in need, as your Son did. Amen



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
