Another fantastic and successful sports day for SJP! The weather was ideal, sunny but not too hot!

The day got off to a great start with around 200 pupils competing in heats for the field events during the morning. By lunch time the competition was well underway and spirits were high when the whole of SJP went to the track to join in for the afternoon session.

The level of athletic talent at the track was fantastic. Ciaran Mooney (Y9), Daniel Williams (Y8) and Rachel Tullet (Y10) all broke school records in the 100m with times of 11.51secs, 11.89secs and 13.18secs respectively and Jordan Thompson was a very strong competitor for 7MT, winning the 200m in 31.67secs.

Michael Deegan (Y10) beat last year's record

and completed the 1500m in 5.03 mins and William Farrimond (Y10) was not far behind, finishing after 5.08 mins. Kayla Pearson (Y8) performed very well in the long jump, achieving a distance of 3m60, with Kristian Brown (Y9) setting a new school record of 5m10.

Dominic Crossley and Luke Shaw (Y10) both ran an excellent 800m race finishing after 2.29 mins and Hollie Williams (Y8) brought it home for MT winning the 800m in a time of 2.59 mins.

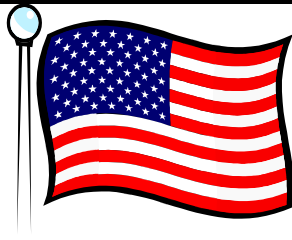

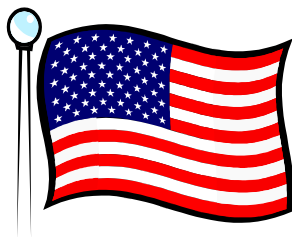

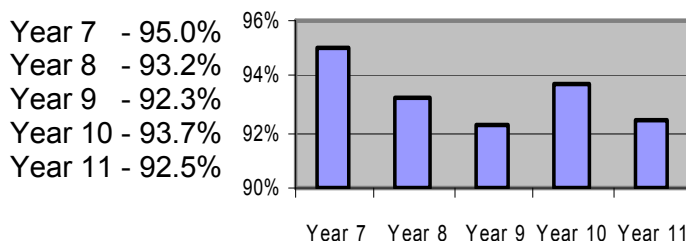

Archaeology News

Awesome Archaeologists!



This week our budding archaeologists learnt all about ancient languages, and how archaeologists were able to decipher ancient Egyptian Hieroglyphics!

In this third session, pupils from Years 9 and 10 learnt how to write their name in ancient Egyptian and Viking Runes. Pupils learnt why the ancient Egyptians placed amulets in the wrappings of Mummies and how archeologists use place names to tell if a town is Viking or Anglo-Saxon in origin. For example Bebington was originally an Anglo-Saxon settlement, because of its name meaning "Bebbe's Farm or Village", whereas Pensby is Viking for "Farm or Village at Penn (the 'hill')".



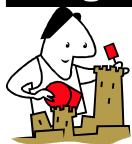
The highlight of this week's session was when pupils were allowed to handle, and use, Cylinder Seals from the Ancient Near East (c. 2000 BC) to make impressions on clay, which they were able to take home with them. Cylinder Seals were used by Ancient Kings to seal important documents. The Kings belonged to the first civilization to have developed written language, thousands of years before Ancient Egyptian Hieroglyphs.



The sessions are being run in partnership with World Museum Liverpool (who are kindly donating genuine artefacts and activities for pupils to handle) and take place Tuesday evenings 3:30 – 4:30. If you'd like to take part, or for more details see Miss Cook, Sc8!

have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a state sweltering with the heat of injustice, sweltering with the heat of oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the colour of their skin but by the content of their character.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day, down in Alabama, with its vicious racists, with its governor having his lips dripping with the words of interposition and nullification; one day right there in Alabama, little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

I have a dream today.

I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together."
