



Olympic Win - Park Tour

After successfully winning a competition organised by the London Olympic 'Get Set' Education Programme, two pupils - Allysha Billington 8JB and Mark Mazier 8SB, accompanied by Ms. Allen, Geography Department, had a once in a lifetime opportunity to see first-hand the progress being made in preparing for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.



The competition was Launched by Jonathan Edwards on a visit to Manchester in May last year and was aimed at encouraging schools and colleges to sign up to *Get Set*, the London 2012 Education Programme. This works to inspire young people using the Olympic and Paralympic values, and has already seen over 500 schools in the North West register to become part of it. The Geography



Department signed up to the Get Set Network last April and designed a unit of work for Yr 7. LP6 was based entirely on the London 2012 Olympic Games and included a wide range of geographical issues including sustainable development. We also investigated London as a Brand and World City. The unit culminated in the Geography Olympics which demonstrated the true Olympic values of Equality, Excellence, Determination, Friendship, Inspiration, Courage and Respect.

This was a fantastic prize and we had the opportunity to tour the park in a special bus to see some of the iconic facilities which will pay host to the world's greatest athletes in 2012. We also had the opportunity to mingle with past and present Olympians. Manchester-born Olympic Gold and Silver medallist **Darren Campbell** was on hand to tell his story of living the Olympic dream, while **Shaunna Thompson** (100m Commonwealth Youth Games record-holder and Sale Harrier) shared her ambitions for competing at London 2012 - and, of course, **Jonathan Edwards** (current world record holder for the triple jump) and ex-swimmer **Steven Parry** (200 butterfly bronze medallist in Athens) were available for a photo or two. Both pupils were interviewed for BBC

NW Tonight and Mark's comments were released in the official press release of the tour. He commented:



"It was really exciting seeing the Olympic Park. I think it's brilliant that London is hosting the Games. My favourite Olympians are Mark Foster and Usain Bolt and I think London 2012 will inspire lots of young people my age to follow their ambitions and dreams and maybe one day be an Olympian themselves."



Music Festival

Jacob Thomas and Luke Piggott performed the Green Day classic "Time of Your Life". The SJP youth theatre group performed a stunning rendition of "All that Jazz" from Chicago.

The SJP Brass Band showed they are going from strength to strength with a powerful rendition of the theme tune to 2001 a space odyssey, led from the front as always by Mr R Austin.

An amazing night for SJP and a taster of great things to come from the Performing Arts team; now we are all looking forward to the Music Festival 2010 which will be even bigger and better!



CAFOD "One World Week"

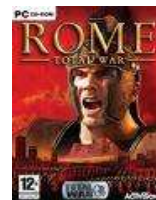

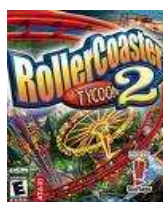
ICT Extra-Curricular Activities

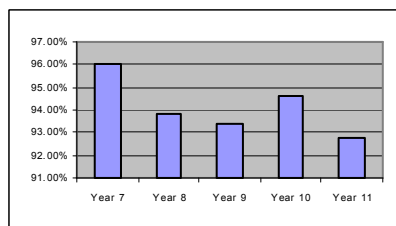

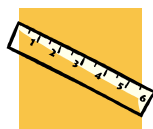
