SJP's Got Talent





Weekly Theme - 'Sorry is the Hardest Word'

Luke 13:6-9

Jesus told this story: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard. He came looking for some fruit on the tree, but he found none. So the man said to his gardener, 'I have been looking for fruit on this tree for three years, but I never find any. Cut it down. Why should it waste the ground?' But the servant answered, 'Master, let the tree have one more year to produce fruit. Let me dig up the dirt around it and put on some fertiliser. If the tree produces fruit next year, good. But if not, you can cut it down."

One of the most difficult words that we have to say is "sorry", often it's because we don't really want to face the truth about ourselves that we are not perfect.
