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# **Enterprise Day Continued...**



Pupils had to create an online product or service that would be profitable and sustainable in today's market place. The day started with the pupils being split into groups and each group appointing a project leader. Their brief was to come up with an online product or service that would be successful in today's market and decide who their target audience should be. After thinking of a product they considered areas like the customer profile, the '4ps' of marketing and the 'USP' of their product or service. In the afternoon they presented their ideas to a panel of judges in a 'Dragons Denmeets The X-Factor' type format. Pupils also had to deliver a presentation from the stage - quite a challenge! The judges or 'Dragons' then offered their views on all the presentations and judged an overall winner. All were of a very high standard but the winning team were from 8TL- and their product was targeted at young single people with a high IQ. It was called-"Just Geeks" and was based on an on-line company that ran a dating agency for people with high intelligence. Their presentation was incredibly entertaining; Each team member received a prize.

Please be with all those who are threatened by injury and illness.


Those whose homes are destroyed and are refugees.

## Spot the prepositions!

# Weekly Theme - 'Generosity'



Are we sometimes like the rich people in our gospel reading, holding onto the things that we value and giving the 'poor' only a token of our wealth? May we, who live comfortably in the western nations of our world, not attract the condemnation of Jesus who said "Woe to you rich."

## Mark 12:38-44

As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the market places and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets. They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few pence.

Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."
