

WEEKLY THEME - "BREAD THAT GIVES LIFE"



John 6: 51-58

I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started

arguing among themselves, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?'

Jesus replied to them: In all truth I tell you, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise that person up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in that person. $\,$

As the living Father sent me and I draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will also draw life from me.

This is the bread which has come down from heaven; it is not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.

The Feast of Body and Blood of Jesus.

Changing our ways is never easy, just ask someone who is trying to lose weight and has signed up for Slimming World or Weightwatchers.

Chocolates and sweets and cream cakes seem to continually cry out to be eaten. It's not easy to change.

Our sin is a lot like our liking food that if we have too much of is not good for us. We can find ourselves locked into negative behaviour that we cannot get out of.

Most of us try so hard to move from hatred and anger or pride to something that is a better way of living. As Christians we do this by following the example of Jesus, and Sometimes this can seem like an never ending task for us.

But if we think about it isn't transformation at the heart of what happens during mass? The bread and wine are changed 'through the words of Consecration said by the priest into the Body and Blood of Jesus.' When we receive Holy Communion the real presence of Jesus enters us. This presence of Jesus inside us has the power to heal and change us.

This is what is at the heart of Communion. In Communion we receive the bread that gives us life and can transform us into living our life in a new and exciting way.

With all the horrible events happening in our country in these last few days and weeks, we have never been in such need of transformation.

Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, nourish me with your Body and Blood so that I may become what I receive in showing your loving presence to a world in such need.
