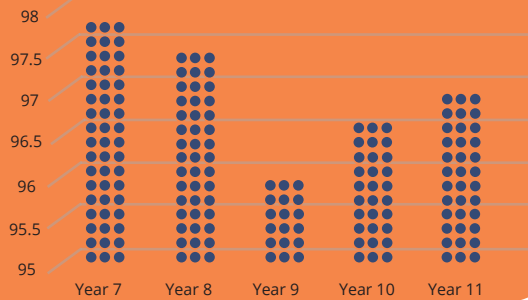

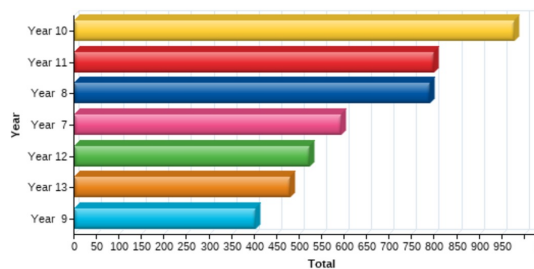

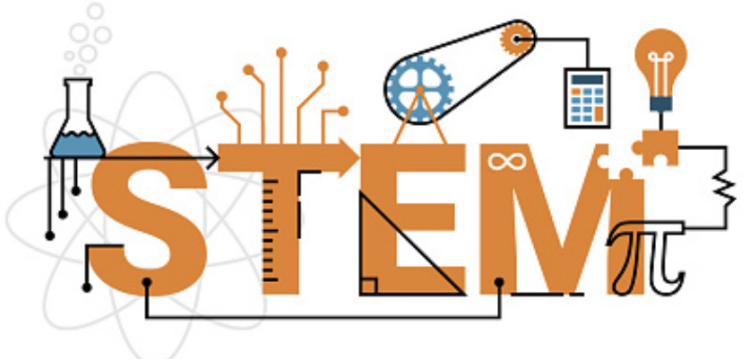
# Exciting STEM Projects

SPOT THE PREPOSITIONS!

Prepositions are words such as “in” and “on” and “off” that show you the relationship between two things. They often tell you where one thing is in relation to another.

There are nine examples below that you need to find and circle.

Top Tip: A preposition always comes before a noun.

PREPOSITION – OFF / OF.

WEEKLY THEME “PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE”

Luke 2: 22-40

In Luke’s Gospel we are introduced to a couple of characters who have been waiting for a long time for a promise to be fulfilled.

Mary and Joseph bring the baby Jesus to the Temple in order to fulfil their religious duty of making an offering for their firstborn. And here they come across this old couple. We don’t know much about these two, Luke tells us that Simeon is touched by the Holy spirit and comes to the temple. Anna, it seems, is just there all the time.

Both Anna and Simeon were people who looked forward with hope. When God acts and the promise that they have been waiting for is fulfilled Anna and Simeon are in tune. They do not miss what is taking place before them. Simeon recognises that his wait is over. That the long-awaited promise of God has been fulfilled in the Child of Jesus.
