

#### "I" or "me"?

A common error in written and spoken English is to confuse "I" and "me".

Look at the rules then try the examples below.

#### RULES.


Always use "I" when it's the subject of the sentence. For example: I like cheese. (NOT "Me like cheese.) Always use "me" when it is the object OR after a preposition. For example: The drink was for my brother and me. The "drink" is the subject. "Me" is the object.



John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world. He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.' I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptising with water was that he might be made known to Israel." John testified further, saying, I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him.
