Major Refurbishment

You will have noticed that the College is undergoing some construction work to completely transform the central teaching block on the site. Work has commenced to replace all windows with double glazed units, to modernise the stairwells and to replace the brick with a mixture of brick effect rendering and white cladding.

The result will be a major improvement to the learning environment in the rooms affected – with the absolute minimum of disruption to lessons during the work.

Each kakuro puzzle is composed of a number of rows and columns, some cells are empty and light coloured, others some have numbers in them. At first look therefore it looks like a crossword. Every sequence of cells in either a row or a column is called a 'run'. At the left of each horizontal run, and at the top of each vertical run, you will see a number. In the image above, you can see, for instance, a '19' in the second cell on the top row. This means simply that the sum of the 3 cells underneath it is 19. Next to the '19' is '39' - this means, therefore, that the 8 cells underneath it sum to 39. And so on, throughout the puzzle
