Dear Headteacher

I am delighted to congratulate you and your school on like excellent performance you have demonstrated at Key Stage 4 in the 2008 Achievement and Attainment Tables published today.

The results for your school show that you are amongst the top performing schools this year based on sustained improvement in the proportion of pupils achieving 5+ A*-C GCSEs (and equivalent) including English and malhematics GCSEs, and also amongst the top performing schools based on the KS2-4 Contextual Value Added measure. This is an excellent achievement shared with only 12 other schools that have performed as well in both measures.

Nationally, schools have made great strides since 1997. Secondary school results are at their highest levels, with substantial progress made in the number of pupils getting five or more good GCSEs (A* - C), including English and maths. The long-term trend is one of sustained improvement and the continuing improvement in results is testament to the dedication of our teachers and hard work of pupils.

Please pass on my thanks and congratulations to your pupils, staff and governors for their hard work and success, and I send my best wishes for sustained improvement in the year ahead.

Well Done Everyone!!

The Government's annual school results summary was published online last week and made available to schools. The figures continue to show the 'amazing climb to the top at the College', as the local press have reported this week. In 2005, the College recorded a commendable 61% of our pupils securing 5 GCSEs at A*-C. That figure rose in 2008 to a fabulous 84%. This figure places the College in the top 2% of schools nationally for its value-added score, the measure the Government uses to describe the progress pupils make while at a school.




