FLANDERS' FIELDS

Following a College trip to the battlefields of the First World War, Mr Austin was so moved by what he had seen, including the conditions that people had to endure between 1914 - 1918 and the size and number of cemeteries (both allied and German), that he thought he would do something.

"I decided that the most valuable thing I had to give was my music so I started writing a Mass setting. This was the first time that I had ever written a piece of classical music, let alone a choral religious work. It was completed in the summer of 2008 and the music tells the story of a Regiment from their arrival at the Western Front through to 11 o'clock on the 11th November 1918, when the guns fell silent."



The CD of this new and original work is available at a cost of £4 from the College Reception. All proceeds will help to fund a five-day concert tour of Germany by SJP Brass and The College Choir later this year.
