Ingestre Hall staff welcomed our Year 9 Performing Arts pupils last week, for a week of tutorials and an experience that we will never forget! Set in the glorious countryside of Staffordshire we pulled up at what we can only describe as a 'grand mansion' which was once home to the Earl of Shrewsbury and his family from the 17<sup>th</sup> century.

The excitement continued as we were briefed on the programme for the week which allowed pupils to gain new experiences in Dance, Drama, Design and Music. The theme for the week was 'Panto with a Twist' and our students embraced the opportunities provided with enthusiasm. Each day they were tutored by professional artists who guided them through the process of putting on a show. They created a soundtrack for the performance work as well as working on drama, whole group

choreographed dances and an interactive set.

The SJP staff ran workshops in the evening which included a "News Flash" evening where students reported on the events of the day through the medium of drama. A Fashion Show was held where pupils designed costumes for staff to model under the theme 'Who would live in a house like this?'. On the final day of tutorials students performed the work they had created in separate groups and the SJP staff were stunned by the quality of the work and professional attitude of our pupils. ### **Hitler on Trial**



On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March, twenty GCSE History students set out to Liverpool with Miss Francis and Mrs Davies to watch "The Trial of Adolf Hitler". Hitler was accused of staring the Second World War and was put on trial as if he had survived the war.

The case saw many leading statesmen of the period questioned and cross examined: Benito Mussolini, Joseph Stalin, Neville Chamberlain and of course, Hitler himself. Many different arguments were put forward such as Chamberlain's policy of appeasement and the way in which other dictators tried to build up their empires in the 1930s.

The jury at the trial were the audience and it was a close decision, which eventually resulted in a guilty verdict. Pupils were extremely lucky to also have the opportunity to interview some of the cast members after the performance and to take part in a workshop to apply what they had found out to the questions they will be required to answer in their examination.

All is all, a really valuable experience.
