SJP Nominated for School of the Year Award

We were delighted to receive the news last week that the College has been shortlisted for the Times Educational Supplement's School of the Year Award. This is a prestigious national title awarded to the secondary school which is deemed by the panel of experts convened by the Times to have outperformed all others across the UK. Being included on a **shortlist of just 7** amounts to an enormous compliment and is a fabulous tribute to all in the College community who have contributed in so many ways in recent years. When we consider that there are **around 5,000** secondary schools all eligible for this coveted national recognition, we are justified in feeling a genuine sense of pride in the tremendous work carried out by pupils, parents, staff and Governors at the College and I am keen to take this opportunity to convey my grateful appreciation for all of this work.

As if that wasn't enough, the Times has also shortlisted the College for the **Outstanding Sustainable School of the Year** – again an enormous compliment to all those who have contributed to our highly successful ecological Project 360. I am thoroughly delighted that the collaborative work of pupils, staff and governors has been recognised in this way at national level. In fact, SJP is the only school nationally to have been shortlisted in two of the categories awarded by the Times and that tells us a lot about how the College community at SJP functions so well from many different angles.

The Times has kindly sent invitations to the College for a group to represent us at the Awards Ceremony in London later this year, and we are very much looking forward to being able to describe the excellent work that goes on at SJP to colleagues from all over the UK educational world. Let me again offer my sincere thanks to all members of the College community on being shortlisted for these awards. Our joint efforts are being recognized at the highest possible level, something which should make us all very proud to belong to that community.

After the fasting and efforts of Lent, it's often easy to let the Good News of the Resurrection of Jesus pass us by, yet our Catholic tradition sees Easter being celebrated for a season of 50 days leading up to Pentecost.

A Reading from St Luke's Gospel

Two of Jesus' friends were walking to Emmaus on the third day after he had been crucified. Sad and confused, they talked about how Jesus had been killed. Jesus came up and walked by their side, but they did not recognise him. They told him what had happened in Jerusalem and how they felt sad and helpless.

Jesus said to them "You foolish men! So slow to understand what has happened!" And he began to explain to them why it had happened and how the prophets had told them about this. Night fell, so the disciples asked him to stay with them. At supper, Jesus took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to the men.

At once their eyes were opened and they realised who it was. But Jesus had gone from their sight. They said to each other "Did not our hearts burn within us as Jesus talked with us and when he broke the bread?" They headed back to his disciples in Jerusalem and told them what had happened: "We have seen the Lord! He is alive!"


