MUSIC TOUR

We left SJP at 1 am and after a very long journey we arrived at our hotel at 6pm the following evening. The next three days were spent sightseeing and performing in concerts. Various activities were undertaken – including a cruise on the River Rhine, a visit to a mechanical musical instrument museum and a fantastic chair-lift ride which took us to the top of the hills from where we could overlook the whole valley.



There were three concerts as part of the tour. The first saw the choir singing mass at St Severus' Church in Boppard, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The acoustics of the church made the choir sound amazing and the church organist said that we were the best choir that they had had perform there! Two further concerts followed which were joint performances of our choir and brass band. The final concert has to have been the best concert the choir and band have ever performed - their singing and playing stunned everybody and made the staff really proud. SJP Football Update

Their determination and endeavour were excellent and they were rewarded with a sensational 35 yard strike from Rhys Hanlon (who is actually in Year 8). From then on the pressure was one way and SJP created several chances to rescue the game. Unfortunately they ran out of time and were unable to grab that vital equaliser. The U19 team were up against Birkenhead Sixth Form College in their semi-final. The game was very close with chances being created by both sides. Charles McInnes and John Skipsey (Year 11) were benefiting from some incisive passes but were unable to capitalise on these chances. The Birkenhead team were beginning to show their pedigree and prove how they had managed to play a full season with only two defeats.



They deservedly took the lead just before half time with a well worked goal. SJP refused to give up though and started the second half brightly. As the clock ticked on, SJP were forced to gamble in search of an equaliser.

Unfortunately we were caught twice on the break and ended up losing 3-0. With a number of Year 11 players gaining valuable experience, the signs are promising for next year's competition.


English Competition
