Year 11—Careers Education

All year 11 pupils have been informed of their Careers course on the VLE. Citizenship lessons from January will focus on pupils understanding and actively taking part in the recruitment process from the initial job advert through to and including the interview itself. By the end of this programme of work all pupils will have completed an application form, a covering letter and they will have produced their curriculum vitae.

In addition their Careers course on the VLE gives all pupils a direct link to a questionnaire on matching their interests and skills to suitable jobs; a link to search for job vacancies; a link to search for Apprenticeship vacancies via the National Apprenticeship Service website and information on Airbus Apprenticeships 2010.

The VLE course will be added to as and when further Careers information comes into College so it is vital that pupils keep in constant touch with their VLE Careers course.

As is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth.
