

## Charity Non-Uniform Day

The last day of term will be a non-uniform day to raise money for the premature baby charity BLISS. On Friday 18th December, all staff and pupils are invited to wear non-uniform and donate £1 during Academic Review. All money raised will be donated to BLISS. SJP is supporting BLISS because every year around 80,000 babies need special care when they are born too soon or too poorly. BLISS provides funding to provide these babies with the life-saving machines and medicine that they need to survive.

At SJP we know that it is likely that some of our students may once have needed special care when they were born and we know how vital the work of BLISS is. The money donated by our staff and pupils will help to fund a parent support helpline, train neonatal nurses and may even pay for life-saving machinery and research. All of this will help thousands of families who will be caring for a sick baby in hospital this Christmas.



## Advent

During the season of Advent our pupils have been encouraged in their Advent Services to think about whether Christmas is really just about presents, or as Christians should we be reflecting the "presence" of Jesus in the world as we celebrate the feast of Christmas.

Last Week's Solution

**Weekly Theme - "Sharing what we have"**

People are generous to others at Christmas; it is the time for sharing, because God gave his gift, his presence to everyone. God so loved the world that he gave us his only Son. **Luke 3:10-18**

The crowds asked, "What should we do?" John replied, "If you have two shirts, give one to the poor. If you have food, share it with those who are hungry." Even corrupt tax collectors came to be baptised and asked, "Teacher, what should we do?" He replied, "Collect no more taxes than the government requires." "What should we do?" asked some soldiers. John replied, "Don't extort money or make false accusations. And be content with your pay." Everyone was expecting the Messiah to come soon, and they were eager to know whether John might be the Messiah. John answered their questions by saying, "I baptise you with water; but someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not even worthy to be his slave and untie the straps of his sandals. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. <sup>17</sup> He is ready to separate the chaff from the wheat with his winnowing fork. Then he will clean up the threshing area, gathering the wheat into his barn but burning the chaff with never-ending fire." John used many such warnings as he announced the Good News to the people.

**Father, the whole world looks with eagerness to the celebration of the birthday of Jesus. May we, in our lives, know the real meaning of happiness and find it in the peace that your Son promises to all who follow him. Amen**
