## Sports News

### Year 11 Cricket

Last week the Year 11 cricket team met Rock Ferry High School away. Rock Ferry won the toss and chose to bat.

SJP bowled well on an extremely bouncy wicket, conceding 81 runs for 6 wickets after our allotted 16 overs. Well done to Andy Powell, Aaran George and Lewis Doyle for particularly good bowling.

SJP went in to bat confident of reaching their target with Andy Powell retiring after reaching the maximum 30 runs. SJP had a mid-order collapse losing 3 wickets in 3 balls. Fortunately Lewis Doyle came in to bat and steadied the ship allowing SJP to achieve the required runs with 8 balls to go.

### Year 9 Cricket

On Wednesday the Year 9 cricket team took part in the first round of the Wirral inter-cricket tournament. They played games against Mosslands and Calday Grange Grammar.

SJP lost their first game against a very strong Mosslands team. Mosslands reached 116 runs from their 8 overs, SJP replied with 64 runs. The 2<sup>nd</sup> game was a much closer affair with Calday only reaching their required runs of 82 with two balls left in the game. SJP gave a much better performance with tighter bowling, sharper fielding and more intelligent batting. Calday had boasted that 4 of their players had represented Cheshire in the previous seasons, so this was an excellent performance from SJP: well done!

### Year 10- Edinburgh





**Weekly Theme—All Shook up**



Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> May was the **Feast of Pentecost**, where we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus’ disciples.

It’s an important Feast that marks the end of the Easter season, so this week’s prayer looks at some of the ways the Spirit has featured in the lives of Jesus and his followers, and also invites us to pray that we’ll share in God’s Spirit too.

Here’s what happened on the first Pentecost, fifty days after Jesus had risen from the dead. The disciples were all gathered together. Try to imagine the atmosphere as they received God’s Spirit.

*When the Feast of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Without warning there was a sound like a strong wind, gale-force; no one could tell where it came from. It filled the whole building. Then, like a wild fire, the Holy Spirit spread through their ranks, and they started speaking in a number of different languages as the Spirit promised.*

**Acts 2:1-4**

Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit to fill his followers with faith, courage and strength. He kept his promise, and the wonderful faith and courage of his followers enabled his Church to spread across the world. The Apostles’ lives would never be the same again. Their lives were truly “*all shook up*” by the Holy Spirit working in them and through them.

We “see” that faith working through the lives of our house Patron Saints and the examples that they have given to us. We can also “see” that faith in the members of our own families who throughout the generations have handed on their gift of faith to us.

And now it’s our turn.

**Father of light from whom all good gifts come, send your Holy Spirit into our lives, that we may be filled with the faith and courage which we need to live as faithful Christians so we may live in and look after this troubled world in which we live.**
