## Theme for the Week: ' SAY NO TO VIOLENCE '



Monday 21<sup>st</sup> September is Global Ceasefire Day, a day that each one of us is asked to think about the violence, hate and loss of life that armed conflict and war brings to our world today. It is also a day when as Christians we should pledge to do all that we can to prevent violence happening.

Since the end of the Second World War in 1945 there have been some 250 major wars in which over 50 million people have been killed, tens of millions made homeless, and countless millions injured and bereaved. Today troops and civilians are being killed and maimed in Afghanistan and Iraq.

In the history of warfare the twentieth century stands out as the bloodiest and most brutal - three times more people have been killed in wars in the last ninety years than in all the previous five hundred

Violence breeds violence. Jesus would never tolerate it. He stopped his disciples arguing with each other, he stopped Peter using a sword in his defence and he died a victim of extreme violence.

As Christians each one of us is called to follow the example given to us by Jesus.

There is no place in a Christian community like ours for any forms of violence; and that includes people with attitudes and violent language.
