These skills were developed throughout the day and were clearly demonstrated in the final presentation.



eating for teenagers. From that topic they had to come up with a product or service that they believed could be successful. In the afternoon the pupils got to present their ideas



to a panel of judges in a 'Dragons Den' meets the X-Factor' type format. In total sixteen presentations were made which meant all Year 8 pupils had to deliver a presentation from the stage. The judges or 'Dragons' then offered their views on the presentations and then judged an overall win. All were of a very high standard but the winning team were from 8JB and their product was targeted at the elderly. It was called "E-Pad" and was based on the "I Pad" but provided a talking service for the elderly that controlled every aspect of their life so they could continue to live independently. 



Attendance figures up to 26.11.2010




