Sixth Form Visit to Andalucia



On Thursday 10th February, ten Sixth Formers flew to Andalucía in southern Spain. The mood of the group was one of excitement at the prospect of discovering the heart of 'Real' Andalucían and Spanish culture. We saw sights such as 'Plaza Bibrambla' and the spectacular Cathedral in Granada. On day two, the journey to Seville took us through field upon field of olive trees. In 1492 it was from Seville that Columbus set sail down the Guadalquivir River and out into the Atlantic to discover a new, faster route to India, and in doing so prove that the earth was round, not flat. We also visited the Alcázar and the Plaza de España which is on the front of the Listos 1 book! Day three was all about Granada. The day began with a traditional Spanish Saturday morning breakfast of '*Chocolate y Churros*', thick hot chocolate with a type of doughnut. The Alhambra was absolutely stunning and as it is perched at the top of a hill overlooking the city, the panoramic views of the city and its surroundings were breathtaking. The Alhambra was busy as it was a Saturday, but nevertheless we waited for the best opportunity to unroll the banner and take that all-important front page newsletter picture. We also visited a great viewpoint in the Albayzín and had the whole bullring to ourselves. On day four, we went to Sierra Nevada, a ski resort only 35 minutes drive from the Costa del Sol. Here we messed around in the snow and had lots of fun. That evening we went for a final night meal at a local neighbourhood bar. The calamaris and octopus went down a treat and gave us the energy to head back into town for what was a fantastic spectacle, a Flamenco show!



In this week's Gospel we are told not to worry about our lives. Doesn't this sound like the famous hit by Bobby McFerrin, *Don't Worry Be Happy* Even though we live in a world that is chock-full of toys,

comforts, luxuries, computers etc, fewer and fewer people seem to experience true peace and satisfaction in their lives. Rather we continue to experience more and more worry and anxiety. Life is full of problems. In every situation, in every difficulty or problem, in all circumstances, Matthew in our gospel knows one thing we should do rather than worry, and that is: take it to the Lord in prayer. Matthew does not ask us to deny that we've got problems or to pretend as if they are not there. He urges us rather to face our problems squarely, not with worry but with prayer. Turn worries into prayers.

Matthew 6:24-34

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.
