Gordon Brown Visits SJP

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Work-Related Learning

Pupils in Year 10 and Year 12 will be starting to prepare for a weeks work experience in the Summer Term. This is to give them real life experience of the world of work, and will also allow the pupils to gain experience of an area relevant to their chosen area of study at university or career path.

Year 10 will be on Work Experience between 4th and 8th July 2011 and Year 12 between 20th and 24th June 2011.

All pupils and students will have to complete a selfplacement form which needs to be signed by parents/carers. This allows for the relevant health and safety checks to be carried at their work experience placement.

Year 12 need to complete their self placement form and return them to College by FRIDAY NOVEMBER 12th 2010 and Year 10 by FRIDAY 10th DECEMBER 2010. All pupils will be having an assembly to help support them in this process.

Health and Safety

Parents and carers are advised that they must meet with Mr Harrison at 8.30 am in the Atrium on the return to College of their son/daughter following an injury that will interfere with their safe movement around the site - this includes the use of crutches in particular. Any pupil/student whose movement is impaired must be risk assessed before being allowed to continue with their timetable.





Luke 16:19-32 The Rich Man and Lazarus

There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day. At his gate was laid a beggar named Lazarus, covered with sores and longing to eat what fell from the rich man's table.

Even the dogs came and licked his sores.

"The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. In hell, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side. So he called to him, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this fire.

"But Abraham replied, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, while Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here and you are in agony. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us.' "He answered, 'Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my father's house, for I have five brothers. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.' "Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them.'

'No, father Abraham,' he said, 'but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'

"He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'
