



GOOD NEWS

Today we can see that gift of Jesus in the people around us: people who are honest and sincere, people who normally do not realise themselves just how wonderfully they show that they possess the gift of the Holy Sprit, the good news promised to us by Jesus.

John 14:15-21

"If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. On that day you will realise that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. Anyone who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them."

On Sunday we also celebrated the Feast Day of the Ascension of Jesus.

This feast marks the end of Jesus appearing to his followers after his Resurrection. What happened on that first Ascension Day is a little mysterious. But for those who follow Jesus it is the *promise* he made that matters: the promise that as Jesus lives with his Father, so, after we die, shall we. The promise that there is life after death really is "Good News!
