Weekly Theme - 'What Gives You Life'



On Sunday, as Catholics, we celebrated the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. At the Last Supper, on the day before he died, Jesus gave the disciples a very special gift of himself in the form of bread and wine. He told his disciples that, whenever they met together and said the words, "This is my body" over the bread and "This is my blood" over the wine, he would be with them in a very special way. The bread and wine

would still look like bread and wine but, through his power, we would be able to receive Jesus into our bodies in a very special way. Jesus knew that, just as in human life, we need food and drink to keep us alive, so in our spiritual lives we need Jesus to nourish and sustain us . He feeds us with himself, with his words, through the Scriptures and with the sacrament of his body and blood. As we eat the sacred body and blood of Jesus, we share with one another, so our community is made strong as we grow personally in strength.

John 6:51-58

I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world." Then the Jews began to argue sharply among themselves, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever,"

Lord Jesus Christ, we believe that you live among us and we worship your presence in the sacrament of your Body and Blood. May the same Body and Blood give us strength to live our Christian life always being faithful to you. Amen
