## Olympics

This is the London 2012 Olympic Torch!



The torch was designed in East London and features 8,000 cut out circles which represent the 8,000 people who will carry the torch on its journey around Britain.

The torch stands 800mm high. You may have heard about the Olympic Torch Relay which starts on 19<sup>th</sup> May, this is where the torch gets carried around by people called torch bearers who have been chosen for this role due to their inspirational stories. The torch and relay were an important part of the Olympic Games of Ancient Greece, which is where the Games originate. During these games a flame burnt continually on the altar of the goddess Hera. In addition, heralds were summoned to travel throughout Greece to announce the games and declare a sacred truce for the duration. We still keep this tradition today through our Olympic Torch Relay!

The Olympic Flame will come within 10 miles of 95% of people in the UK and will arrive in Birkenhead Park on the evening **Friday 1<sup>st</sup> June**. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity so make sure you don't miss out viewing the very special Olympic Torch!


Word of the week:





## Weekly Theme - 'Neighbors Everybody Needs Good Neighbors'



### John 15:9-17

*"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my*

*Father's commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command. I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit — fruit that will*

*last — and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. This is my command: Love each other.*

The theme song of Neighbours can be our song for the week; the words "Everybody should be good neighbours" is straight from the gospel of Jesus. Only two principals are necessary for a life that is full, Jesus said: "love God and love one another as I have loved you."
