
DT: GCSE & A Level Work



There is a saying 'Great Oaks from little acorns grow'; The Christian Church in our world today numbers 1.8 billion members and it started with just twelve apostles. All kinds of birds can rest in the branches of a mighty Oak tree, and the Church takes and

gives home to every kind of person; it is the kingdom of God on Earth for every person who shows faith and wants to join it regardless of their race language or culture. We have to be Ambassadors for our faith in our world today, our role is to lead others to meet Jesus, by the example we give and the way in which we live our lives. This week we also celebrate **Refugee Week**. Refugee Week is a unique opportunity to celebrate the positive contributions that refugees and asylum seekers make to the UK and to promote understanding about why people seek sanctuary.

Mark 4:26-34

The Parable of the Growing Seed

He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though

he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain - first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

The Parable of the Mustard Seed

Again he said, "What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds on Earth. Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds can perch in its shade."

With many similar parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand. He did not say anything to them without using a parable. But when he was alone with his own disciples, he explained everything.

Almighty God, you are our hope and our strength. Help us to follow Christ and to live according to your Will.
