
Art News



A group of GCSE & A level Art students recently had the unique experience of having an exclusive and private tour of a major art exhibition conducted by the artist himself.



Example:


The boss would hire almost any young man who had the **gumption** to ask for a job

Weekly Theme - 'Helping Others'



After Jesus left the synagogue with James and John, they went to Simon and Andrew's home. Now Simon's mother-in-law was sick in bed with a high fever. They told Jesus about her right away. So he went to her bedside, took her by the hand, and helped her sit up. Then the fever left

her, and she prepared a meal for them.

That evening after sunset, many sick and demonpossessed people were brought to Jesus. The whole town gathered at the door to watch. So Jesus healed many people who were sick with various diseases, and he cast out many demons. But because the demons knew who he was, he did not allow them to speak.

Before daybreak the next morning, Jesus got up and went out to an isolated place to pray. Later Simon and the others went out to find him. When they found him, they said, "Everyone is looking for you."

But Jesus replied, "We must go on to other towns as well, and I will preach to them, too. That is why I came." So he travelled throughout the region of Galilee, preaching in the synagogues and casting out demons.

Mark 1: 29-39

The symbol of the genuine Christian is the apron. Jesus took the model of the suffering servant, foretold by Isaiah, and put himself at the total service of others. At the Last Supper he got up from the table, put an apron around him, and washed his friends' feet. This was normally the job of the lowest servant in the household. "Now do what I have done," he said.

The sign of a true follower of Jesus is that he or she is prepared to wait upon others and serve them.

May we learn to help and serve one another hum-

as your Son has shown us.

Through the prayer of the humble Jesus may we die to arrogance and pride and grow in humility and peace
