The Specialist Schools and Academies Trust has identified **SJP** as one of the **top 10%** schools in the country for **progress** using the new Government value added measure.

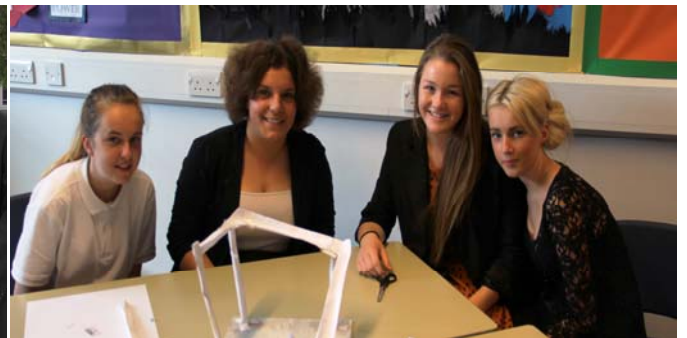
Year 10 Enterprise Day

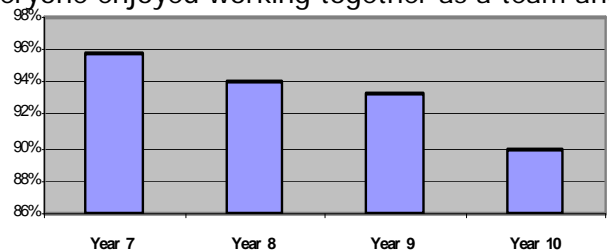

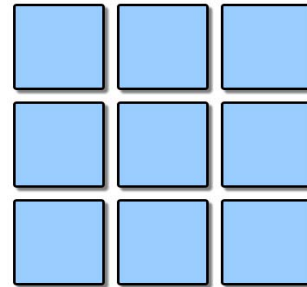
