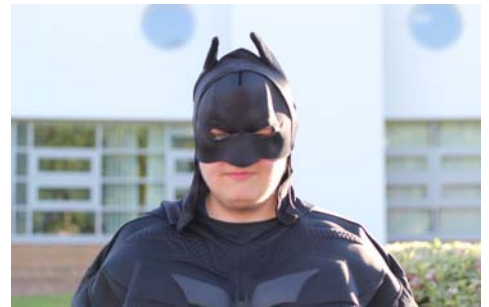




Year 11 Celebration Ball

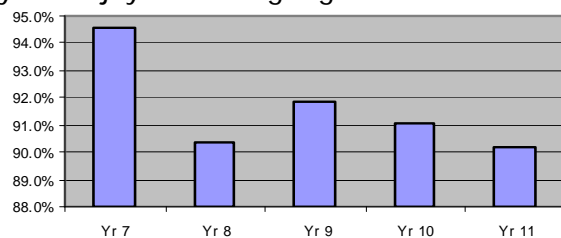

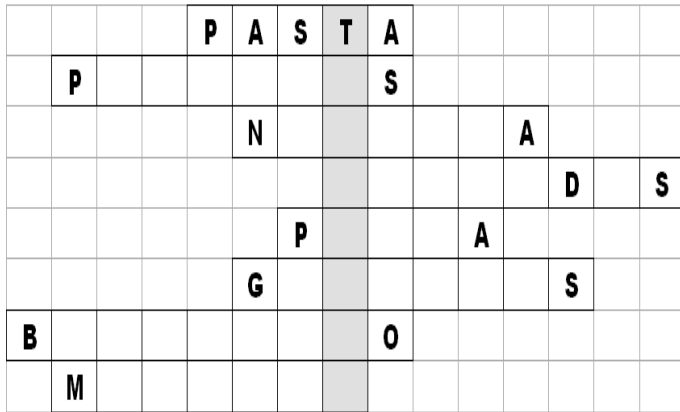
