


# SJP Nativity

and bringing a present for the host. If we're going out for a meal, we have to make sure that we haven't already eaten.





# Weekly Theme - 'A Change of Heart'

John, the Baptist, was a startling sight; people flocked out from the city to see him. He told the people that they had to behave better, if they wanted the Messiah to appear among them. A change of heart was necessary or the Christ would not come. Everyone of us could make a good preparation for the coming of Jesus at Christmas by the way we treat others around us, maybe this means that we have to change our attitude to people as well.

### Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; a voice of one calling in the wilderness; Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. John wore clothing made of camel's hair with a leather belt around

his waist; he ate locusts and wild honey. And this was his message. "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I baptise you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Father, in Heaven your Son's birthday draws near.

May the greed and selfishness, which tempts so many people at this time of year, not blind us to the real meaning of his coming into our world. **Amen** 



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
