



#### Weekly Theme - Forgiving Each Other

One of the most important ideals that Jesus sets before us is forgiveness. "How often should we forgive one another?" Peter asked Jesus that question and he was told "Times without number (seventy-

seven times)". So important is forgiveness that God attaches the condition that we will not receive forgiveness from him, unless we freely forgive those who hurt us. Matthew 18:21-35 Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? "Up to seven times? " Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." The kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. At this the servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' The servant's master took pity on him, cancelled the debt and let him go. But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred silver coins. He grabbed him and began to choke him. "Pay back what you owe me!" he demanded. His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, "Be patient with me, and I will pay it back." But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw

what had happened, they were outraged and went and told their master everything that had happened.

Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant," he said, "I cancelled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?" In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he could pay back all he owed. "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

Almighty God there are times when we need to turn to you and seek your forgiveness; may we offer the same love and forgiveness to those who hurt us. Amen

On **14<sup>th</sup> September** we celebrate the Feast of **The Triumph of the Cross.** The symbol of the cross has become the sign of Christianity, the sign of love and forgiveness. From the cross Jesus prayed, "Father forgive them they do not know what they are doing." It is the sign that is marked on each of us when we are Baptised and the sign we use before and after we pray.

God our Father, your son in his love and obedience to you, accepted death on a cross. May that cross be for us a sign of love, obedience and forgiveness. We ask this through Christ our Saviour.
