Exams Information for students taking GCSEs in November 2011

In November, Year 10 and 11 students will be sitting English, Maths and/or Science GCSEs. All students with exam entries for November should have received a green Individual Pupil Timetable from their Head of Learning, Learning Coach or Form Tutor. **If you think you have been entered for an exam, and you have not received a timetable, please ask for the Exams Officer at the Reception Desk.**

A booklet entitled 'November 2011 – Exams Information for Parents & Pupils' is available via the school website. Hard copies are available on Reception. This booklet contains an exam timetable and important information about exam requirements and regulations.

Morning exams will begin at 9.00 am. Afternoon exams will begin at 1.30 pm. Students must assemble in School Yard at 8.30 for morning exams, and 1.00 for afternoon exams, where they will receive further instructions from staff.

Candidates must bring the correct equipment to each exam:



The Greatest Story Ever Told



Parking Enforcement Notice

The trip was a great success with pupils seeing world famous art works and gaining lots of inspiration for their coursework projects.



See Inside Manufacturing

A group of Year 12 and 13 Product Design student's visited the 'See Inside Manufacturing' event at Vauxhall Motors, Ellesmere Port on Wednesday 18th October.

The 'Careers Fair' gave pupils the opportunity to gain information on apprenticeships, undergraduate and graduate opportunities and the benefits of working at Vauxhall's.



The student's took part in a range of exciting hands-on activities where they learnt about different aspects of manufacture at the site. They learnt about the impact of different car engines on the environment. Students tried out different types of safety gear to learn about the importance of health and safety in a busy factory environment.

A tour of the factory floor gave students an insight into the manufacture of different Vauxhall car models, allowing them to watch each stage of production from the delivery of the components to the finished product. The students were introduced to heat sensor equipment used by the quality team to check the cars are correctly assembled and even had their photograph taken by a mini sensor which they took away on their own souvenir keyring! All student's thoroughly enjoyed the day.



COD: 2 HAKE: 3, COLEY: 6, SALMON: 10
The formula for a word of length n is
$$\frac{(n-1)!}{\left(\frac{n-1}{2}\right)! \left(\frac{n-1}{2}\right)!}, \text{ if } n \text{ is odd}$$

$$\frac{(n-1)!}{\left(\frac{n}{2}-1\right)! \left(\frac{n}{2}\right)!}, \text{ if } n \text{ is even}$$

So BARRACUDA gives $8! / (4!4!) = 70$.

"Serving others"

People remember surprises! The Disciples who followed Jesus I am sure never forgot their surprise, when at the height of his fame, massive crowds came flocking to

see him, he said, "I came into this world to serve, not to be served." Almost his last action was to get up from the dinner table and wash the feet of his friends.

"Now serve one another, like that," he said. To be a true follower of Jesus, we have to help others without being asked to do so.

Matthew 23:1-12

Now Jesus turned to address his disciples, along with the crowd that had gathered with them. "The religion scholars and Pharisees are competent teachers in God's Law. You won't go wrong in following their teachings on Moses. But be careful about following them. They talk a good line, but they don't live it. They don't take it into their hearts and live it out in their behaviour. Instead of giving you God's Law as food and drink by which you can banquet on God, they package it in bundles of rules, loading you down like pack animals. They seem to take pleasure

in watching you stagger under these loads, and wouldn't think of lifting a finger to help. Their lives are perpetual fashion shows, embroidered prayer shawls one day and flowery prayers the next. They love to sit at the head table at church dinners, basking in the most prominent positions, preening in the radiance of public flattery.

Don't let people do that to you, put you on a pedestal like that. You all have a single Teacher, and you are all classmates. Don't set people up as experts over your life, letting them tell you what to do. Save that authority for God; let him tell you what to do.

No one else should carry the title of 'Father'; you have only one Father, and he's in heaven. And don't let people manoeuvre you into taking charge of them. There is only one Life-Leader for you and them - Christ. Do you want to stand out? Then step down. Be a servant. If you puff yourself up, you'll get the wind knocked out of you. But if you're content to simply be yourself, your life will count for plenty."

God of power and mercy, only with your help can we be gentle and humble in helping and serving one another. Help us to imitate the loving service of your Son, Jesus. Amen


