

Science in the News

Scientists have taken the first ever photograph of a strand of DNA (pictured). DNA is the genetic material contained in every single cell in our bodies that makes us who we are – every single person in the entire world will have their own unique DNA strand. Scientists James Watson and Francis Crick first suggested that DNA had a "double helix" structure in 1953, but nobody has ever really seen a photograph of it - until now.




Science Riddle



In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: "A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.
