Cream Tea Friday





Weekly Theme - 'Compassion'

Luke 7: 11-17

Soon afterwards, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and His disciples and a large crowd went along with Him. As he approached the town gate, a dead person was being carried out - the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the town was with her. When the Lord saw her, His heart went out to her and He said, "Don't cry."

Then He went up and touched the bier they were carrying him on, and the bearers stood still. He said, "Young man, I say to you, get up!" The dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him back to his mother.

They were all filled with awe and praised God. "A great prophet has appeared among us." they said. "God has come to help His people" This news about Jesus spread throughout Judea and the surrounding country.

This week's gospel passage immediately follows the gospel that we read last week, when we read about Jesus healing the rich man's slave. In this week's gospel, Jesus has compassion for the mother whose only son has died. Jesus gave the mother the gift of her son brought back to life.

We so often hear sad stories about people who are very sick or who are in great need, and we naturally want to help them in whatever way we can. When, like Jesus in this week's gospel we feel for someone, we suffer with them, we offer our compassion, but most importantly we should pray for them.

God of wisdom and love, from You all goodness comes.

Help us to show Your love and goodness to those in need, just as Your Son, Jesus did.
