

Weekly Theme - 'Saying Thank You'

Luke 17: 11-19

Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem. He travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As He was going into a village, ten men met Him. They had a skin disease called Leprosy. They were standing close by. And they called out in a loud voice, "Jesus! Master! Have pity on us!"

Jesus saw them and said, "Go. Show yourselves to the priests." While they were on the way, they were healed. When one of them saw that he was healed, he came back. He praised God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked Him. The man was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, "Weren't all ten healed? Where are the other nine? Didn't anyone else return and give praise to God except this outsider?"

Then Jesus said to him, "Get up and go. Your faith has healed you."

'I know what I want and I want it now' sums up the attitude of many people today, and Christians are no exception. However as Christians we are supposed to be God's 'Thank you people'. The Most important prayer our faith is called the 'Eucharist' which means, the 'Thanks Giving'. To live a truly Christian life we should be full of joy and giving thanks to God for all the good things He gives us each and every day.

So why didn't all ten return to Jesus to give thanks to God? Why was it that nine never bothered? Perhaps some of them were angry. Maybe they were upset that they had missed so much in life. Perhaps some were like little children who were never taught to say, "Thank you," as though they had a right to all good things in the world.

One of those former lepers, a Samaritan, returned to Jesus. He was out of the mainstream, not even Jewish. He wasn't one of the chosen people. But he knew that God had chosen him. He knew that he had received a grace from God. He knew that he hadn't done anything to deserve this gift, but was the recipient of God's compassion. He wanted others to rejoice with him. He wanted Jesus to know how grateful he was and he returned to thank Jesus.

This is all God wants from us. He wants us to show our gratitude by being good to others as He has been good to us.

Father, the hand of your loving kindness powerfully but gently guides all the moments of our day.

Give us the gift of the same loving kindness that we may treat everyone with love and respect today and every day.
