





Weekly Theme - Authority

Mark 1: 21-28

Jesus and his followers went to Capernaum. On the Sabbath day He went to the synagogue and began to teach. The people were amazed at His teaching, because He taught like a person who had authority, not like their teachers of the law. Just then, a man was there in the synagogue who had an evil spirit in him. He shouted, "Jesus of Nazareth! What do you want with us? Did you come to destroy us? I know who you are - God's Holy One!"

Jesus commanded the evil spirit, "Be quiet! Come out of the man!" The evil spirit shook the man violently, gave a loud cry, and then came out of him.

The people were so amazed they asked each other,

"What is happening here? This man is teaching something new, and with authority. He even gives commands to evil spirits, and they obey him." And the news about Jesus spread quickly everywhere in the area of Galilee.



This week's Gospel tells us about Jesus having authority over demons. Jesus liberated the man held hostage by demons. People were amazed; they believed that Jesus stood against those forces that compete with God for control of people's lives. They saw his words powerfully change people's lives. Although we might see demons differently in our day and age, people can still be 'held hostage' by fear, drugs, alcohol, prejudice, greed and nationalism. It is all too easy for people to lose control to these forces that can hurt themselves and others.

Jesus' words offer freedom. In our world today we need more people who are willing to share those words, to live their lives standing against all the forces that compete with God for control of the lives of others. This week we pray for courage to be able to speak up like Jesus, and to challenge people whose lives are held hostage by modern day demons.
