


LIVERPOOL UNIVERSITY BUSINESS CHALLENGE.

I Am Malala by Malala Yousafzai

Malala Yousafzai was ten years old when the Taliban took control of her region. They said music was a crime, women weren't allowed to go to the market and girls couldn't go to school. Malala fought for her right to be educated, and on 9 October 2012, she was shot point-blank on her way home from school. No one expected her to survive. Now she is an international symbol of peaceful protest and

the youngest ever winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.





WEEKLY THEME "LIVING IN PEACE"

John 14: 23-29

Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

"All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

"You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe.

It's great when we feel all-together at peace with ourselves and the world around us. Peace comes from

inside us, from feeling good about ourselves and knowing that all our relationships, with family and friends, the people we meet each day and God are in good working order. In other words we have a good conscience about everything. We can only keep such a wonderful sense of peace if we remain close to Jesus and live our lives in the way that he wants us to, then we share in his peace. When we turn away from Jesus and become concerned only about ourselves, we become selfish and self-centred wanting to take rather than give. Peace is replaced by greed. We only have to look at the newspaper headlines to discover that our world is a far from peaceful place. Let's take up the challenge today and be a people who live in peace with each other, then our way of living will become an example that others will want to follow.
