Spotlight on: Cuba

Cuba is the largest island in the Caribbean, it was the first island Christopher Columbus 'discovered' on his route to discover India and in 1492 the island was declared Spanish

territory and Spanish has since been the official language of Cuba. Until the late 1950s Cuba was heavily controlled by the United States until communist revolutionaries led by Fidel Castro and Che Guevara toppled the government in the Cuban Revolution of 1959. Today, Cuba remains one of the world's four self-declared communist states. Fidel Castro continued as leader until 2008 when he stood down due to ill health. His brother Raúl Castro now leads the country. Baseball is by far the most popular sport in Cuba, so too is boxing. Numerous Olympic boxing champions are Cuban such as Teófilo Stevenson who won three Olympic gold medals.





Weekly Theme "Being Childlike"

Mark 10:13-16

People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them.

Reflection

It's a funny old world isn't it! Teenagers like to imagine that they are older than they really are, middle aged people are more inclined to think of themselves as younger, while the elderly often boast about how old they are. In this week's gospel Jesus tells us that whatever age we are, unless we become like little children we will not enter the kingdom of God. He is really telling us that we have to be like little children who are open and trusting, knowing that God is our loving Father.
