Ghana Visit

After nearly 2 years of careful planning and fundraising, July saw 8 of our sixth form students set off for Ghana, to visit our partner school Elmina Catholic Junior school for boys. For months, our students had been writing to their buddies in Ghana, discussing their lives and cultures and getting to know one another. Upon our arrival, the buddies and staff welcomed up with great joy.

Another aspect of the trip consisted of visiting the landmarks of Elmina, such as Elmina Castle and the fishing port. Our students were lucky enough to witness the annual Bakatue festival, when the whole of Elmina head to the harbour to celebrate the opening of the fishing season, when the Head Chief casts his net in to the lagoon. This was such an overwhelming yet amazing experience a highlight of the whole trip.

The most rewarding part of the trip was actually the reason why the whole trip was organised; to build Elmina Catholic Junior boys their own ICT suite and library. For a few days, the students and their buddies worked together to sand and varnish the desks and chairs. Our students also fitted a printer, a projector and 12 laptops, before teaching their buddies how to use the laptops for learning.

All of these resources, was purchased with the money raised by our community. We would like to thank all those who participated in or supported our fundraising events over the past year, to not only give our students the experience of a life time, but also to improve the education of the boys in our partner school. We will keep you updated with the next stage in our on-going partnership with Elmina Catholic Junior boys.

China Visit

Our journey to China this year took us to a province called Shenyang. Here students were welcomed to Northeast Yucai International School where students began a busy timetable of Mandarin lessons and cultural experiences. Students were shown the art of calligraphy and tea making; they were taught how to play traditional Chinese instruments and learnt Martial Arts. Students learnt to count, how to introduce themselves and how to conduct a basic conversation. Students thoroughly enjoyed learning and practised when we were traveling around the city.

At night time in Shenyang the locals would gather in parks or in the city's square and would exercise by dancing. Our students loved watching the locals and even joined in, which attracted quite a crowd!

In Beijing students were able to catch a glimpse of the giant pandas at the zoo. They climbed the Great Wall on a

sun soaked day, visited the Summer Palace and looked in awe at the man-made lake that a former Chinese emperor made for his wife to show his love for her. At the Summer Palace students took a ride on a traditional dragon boat and took pictures of the beautiful red, blue and gold temples that were buried in the surrounding forests. At the temple of the Qing dynasty students climbed the 107 steps that represented the earth, moon and stars.

Meal times were always an exciting part of the day and students relished the opportunities to try new and interesting things, from butterfly larvae, and fish skin, to pig's feet and, more interestingly, chicken's heads! Students tried and tasted them all!

China this year was a fantastic opportunity for all 17 students and we look forward to sharing our experiences and photographs in our assemblies with other year groups.

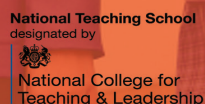

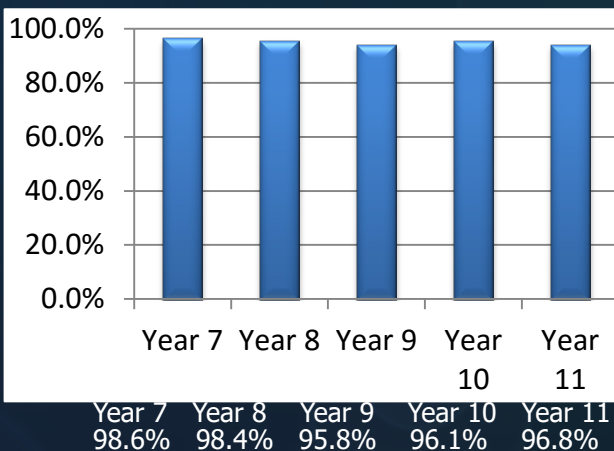

Youth Support Services

Once you are aged 13 or over, we are required by law to pass on certain information to the provider of youth support services in your area. This is the LA support service for young people aged 13 to 19 in England. We must provide both the name and address of you and your parents (and your date of birth) and any further information relevant to the support services' role.

However, until you are aged 16 or older, your parent(s) can ask that no information beyond your name, address and date of birth (and their name and address) be passed on to the youth services provider. This right transfers to you on your 16th birthday. Please inform Mrs C Lamb, Office Manager if this is what you or your parents wish.
