



Las Fallas, the Festival of Fire

Every year in Valencia a festival called "Las Fallas" is celebrated at the start of spring. Las Fallas is celebrated to commemorate St. Joseph's Day, who is the Patron Saint of Carpenters. Throughout mid- March, the city becomes filled with gigantic cardboard figures, called ninots. These figures are extremely life like and are usually made to look like popular Spanish celebrities or politicians.

The ninots are displayed across the city until March 19th, the day known as La Cremá (the burning). Throughout the evening all the figures, except one, are filled with fireworks. At midnight, streetlights are turned off and the ninots are set on fire.

Each year, one of the ninots is spared from ruin by a vote. This ninot is called the Ninot Indultat (the pardoned puppet) and is exhibited in the local Museum along with the winners from previous years.

Just as in this week gospel, the Father of the Prodigal Son didn't wait for his Son to reach the door, instead he ran to meet his son as soon as he saw him in the distance and the first thing he did was to run and place his arms around him to shown him how much

This is what God wants to do for us, all we have to do is to turn towards him, and he will run towards us to show us just how much he

God you are our Father, Mother, Brother and Sister, you cared for us so much that you gave us your Son as the Light of the World. May we place our trust in his guidance as we seek our way in life.
