A selection of our Sixth Form participants are pictured here, all of whom thoroughly enjoyed their experience and can be proud of the they have made in our local community.


# Our annual College Carol Service

Reception.


Whilst there is no charge for the Carol Service tickets, we will, on the evening be collecting donations in aid of local Food Bank charities.
