Lowry Trip

"Nothing short of a triumph", "Dazzlingly inventive...a beautiful, eloquent show", "Funny and extremely moving". Not only has The Curious Incident Of The Dog In The Night-Time received fantastic reviews, it also won five TONY Awards in 2015, including Best Play, Best Actor and Best Director. Last week, 44 SJP students and staff were lucky enough to catch a matinee performance of 'Curious' at the Lowry Theatre, Salford Quays. We travelled by coach to Salford and were immediately impressed by the location.

Surrounded by TV studios and eye-catching architecture, The Lowry is a welcoming and creative space, which attracts a range of companies and artists. The play did not disappoint. It tells the story of Christopher Francis Boone, a boy with autism, who spends the first act investigating the death of his neighbour's dog and the second act travelling by train to London. It is based upon the best-selling novel by Mark Haddon and was adapted for the stage by playwright, Simon Stephens. As well as brilliant acting, script and direction, the technical elements are a massive part of the show and help to give an insight into the mind and condition of Christopher.

Everyone on the trip seemed to really enjoy the play and spoke of it positively on the coach journey home. Comments included "Awesome!", "Absolutely amazing", "Breath-taking", "I liked the Maths equations", "The staging was a cool", "I loved the use of lights and music during the performance" and "It was very funny and they were really good actors." There was also a lot of discussion about Sandy, the "cute" and "adorable" dog. It is worth noting that Lowry theatre staff were very impressed by SJP students and commented on how well everyone had behaved. Well done to all who came along!

WEEKLY THEME "BEING A GOOD EXAMPLE"

Matthew 5:13-16

"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its salty taste, it cannot be made salty again. It is good for nothing, except to be thrown out and walked on.

"You['] are the light that gives light to the world. A city that is built on a hill cannot be hidden. And people don't hide a light under a bowl. They put it on a lamp stand so the light shines for all the people in the house. In the same way, you should be a light for other people. Live so that they will see the good things you do and will praise your Father in heaven."

When Jesus tells His disciples, "You are the salt of the earth." He wasn't speaking about that white stuff in a shaker on the table. He was speaking about wisdom. In Roman times salt was associated with being rich. Slaves were often purchased for salt. The expression, "He's not worth his salt," is based on this.

When Jesus speaks about salt, He is speaking about something that gives us value. And what gives us value is that which we have received from God. That is wisdom. This wisdom, this salt, is a new way of life, far different from the values of the world. The values of the world are selfishness. "Life revolves around me," the world says. "Take care of number one," the world teaches. But this false wisdom, leads only to frustration, fear and despair, that you have wasted your time.

"You are the light of the world," Jesus tells us. Our light must shine as an example to others. We have a responsibility to others. We have been given the wisdom of God. We have a responsibility to let them experience this wisdom, we need to care for others. Our light should shine by being a good example to those who are around us, all we have to do is to have the courage to follow the example given to us by Jesus in the way in which he lived his life.

Father, watch over us, for we are your family. Keep us safe from harm. May no action or thought of our hurt others; for you love each of them, as you love us. Amen.
