YEAR 7 ENTERPRISE DAY


'Inspirational Learning Group' are visiting SJP on Wednesday 31 January to work with Year 7. They will deliver a series of workshops based around developing employability skills – these include team building, communication, marketing and presentation skills.

The activities will be based around a 'Dragons' Challenge', where pupils have to devise a new product for a company that would be profitable and sustainable in today's marketplace. Their task this year is to design a new real life activity for the company called KidZania based in London aimed at 11-14 year olds. This is an indoor activity theme park where pupils get a realistic insight into the adult world by taking part in a choice of 'jobs' which earn them points to take part in other activities.



HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY AT CHESTER CATHEDRAL

On Tuesday 23rd January a selected group of year 8 and 9 pupils went to Chester Cathedral to celebrate Holocaust Memorial Day. They joined with pupils from a number of schools in the North West to take part in a variety of activities anchored in memories of the Holocaust.

The day began with a warm welcome and introduction from the Acting Dean of Chester, Canon Jane Brook. We then had an insightful talk from Holocaust survivor Joanna Millan. In her speech she focused on the notion of marginalised people with a particular reference to her own experiences as someone who had been through the Holocaust and lost her family at a young age.

Following that, pupils took part in interactive workshops which allowed them to integrate with pupils from other schools. In these workshops they engaged in activities about famous historical characters that were associated with the Holocaust such as Anne Frank and Corrie Ten Boom. They also had an opportunity to take part in a joint artwork based on 'The Power of Words' a key theme of this year's Holocaust Memorial Day.

Throughout our stay, pupils enjoyed taking part in canoeing, kayaking, raft building, zipline, climbing wall, mountain biking, bush craft, high ropes, via feretta, and abseil. HAVE YOU EVER CONSIDERED A CAREER IN TEACHING?

School Direct is a one-year, full time teacher training programme. At SJP, all School Direct Associate Teachers (ATs) are allocated a dedicated subject mentor, and guided by specialist tutors. At the end of the year, successful ATs will qualify with QTS and PGCE, which is accredited by the University of Chester.

What are the entry requirements?

- UK university degree 2:1 or above (2:2 for Maths, Physics, Chemistry, MFL) or a recognised equivalent qualification – we also accept applications from final year students due to graduate in 2018
- Grade C or above in GCSE English and Mathematics (Science for Primary)
- At least two full days of school observation

You will be required to undergo an enhanced DBS check to verify your suitability to work with young people

What subjects do we offer?

We currently offer teacher training for Biology, Business Studies, Chemistry, Computer Science, DT, Drama, English, Geography, History, Maths, Media, Modern Foreign Languages, PE, Physics, Primary, RE and Social Sciences.

In addition, our School Experience Programme offers the opportunity to spend a day or two at SJP in your subject department. You will be able to observe classes taking place, engage with pupils, and speak to subject staff and the School Direct ATs who are currently training with us.
